JUDGMENT ENTRY

On March 17, 2020, this Court entered certain findings of fact regarding the outbreak of COVID-19 and the relevant impact of the pandemic on Court operations. On March 20, 2020, this Court issued a Judgment Entry ("Amendment 1") allowing for the temporary receipt of filings by facsimile transmission. On April 15, 2020, this Court issued a Judgment Entry ("Amendment 2") tolling time requirements in accordance with the Ohio Supreme Court's Tolling Order. The Ohio Supreme Court's tolling order expired on July 30, 2020. Also on April 15, 2020, this Court issued a Judgment Entry ("Amendment 3") allowing filings via facsimile transmission for Domestic Relations Division of the Mahoning County Court of Common Pleas.

Effective April 1, 2022, the Court hereby terminates the temporary orders previously set forth as a result of the declared judicial emergency in the March 17, 2020 Judgment Entry. Accordingly, the subsequent Judgment Entries — Amendment 1 and Amendment 3 permitting facsimile filings have now expired. The Judgment Entry — Amendment 2 has expired by its own terms.

Effective April 1, 2022, all Court operations are resumed in normal course. The

Court may conduct virtual proceedings as needed for health, safety and other reasons in accordance with the purpose of the Court and the fair and proper administration of justice.
